PLEASE PLAY A PART IN ANNUAL SALE!!!

The 16th Annual Daylily Plant Sale on Sat. 12 Sept. at the Green Bay Botanical Garden is only a few weeks away. <u>Our</u> sale will be held in the Cornerstone Foundation Hall in the Visitor's Center.

The annual sale is our largest fund raiser of the year. Hence <u>participation by all members is important</u>. Funds generated by the sale will be used to purchase adopt-a-daylily cultivars, bring in national speakers, buy newer cultivars to replace older cultivars in the GBBG/B.A.D. Buds beds, subsidize activities such as Club's bus trip, donate to GBBG projects, etc.

FIRST, THE CLUB REALLY NEEDS YOUR DOUBLE FANS!!!

The greater the number and variety of double fans for sale, the greater the Club's income. By far the largest source of double fans (df's) for the sale is you - the BAD Buds members. Hence the success of the sale particularly depends on the number and variety that you can donate from your gardens. Keep in mind that dividing large clumps can significantly rejuvenate the smaller clump that you replant in your garden. The excess double fans can be donated to the sale. Also you could update your daylily collection by completely removing some of your older cultivars and donate the double fans to the sale where you can purchase df's of newer cultivars.

PLEASE NOTE Although there will be club digs at the GBBG beds and 2 private gardens, the Club will still definitely need your double fans!

PROCEDURES FOR PREPARING FANS: Dig and divide your plants no earlier than Tue. 8 Sept. Foliage should be cut back to 6 to 8". Please wash and dry the roots plus remove as many dead leaves as possible. It is important that fans look as neat and tidy as possible. Separate plant into divisions of two fans (df's) each. Place double fans of each cultivar into a separate plastic bag and include the cultivar name. Drop your df's off at Leo and Eileen Bordeleau's Rose-Hill Gardens (472 Rose-Hill Drive, Oneida) Thurs. 10 Sept or Fri. 11 Sept.

PHOTOS DEFINITELY INCREASE SALES!!!!! Very few people buy daylilies without first seeing the flowers. If you have photos of the cultivars that you are donating, please include them when you bring your plants to Leo and Eileen's. If you do not have photos of your cultivars please contact JoAnn Jankowski (660-3195 or jojomeow@aol.com) asap to allow sufficient time to locate and print photographs of the cultivars that you are donating. Many members who donated fans last year included photos! Please continue to provide photos.

HELP GREATLY NEEDED AT 3 DIG & DIVIDE SESSIONS AT THREE SITES - EACH ON A DIFFERENT NIGHT

INCENTIVES FOR PARTICIPATION IN MULTIPLE DIGS !!!

Work 1 dig you earn \$2 BAD BUCKS per hour worked, work 2 digs you earn \$3 BAD BUCKS per hour for both digs or work 3 digs you earn \$4 BAD BUCKS per hour for all three digs.

For example: if you worked 4 hours at each of the 3 digs, you would earn \$4 BAD BUCKS per hour times 12 hours equals a total of <u>\$48 BAD BUCKS</u>!!!

PLEASE BRING DIGGING AND DIVIDING TOOLS.

PLEASE NOTE If you are willing to work at one, two, or all three digs, please contact Mike Morgan (468.6881 or mmorgan7@new.rr.com.)

DIRECTIONS: Mike and Gloria Morgan live at 2449 Morning Star Trail on Green Bay's east side near the intersection of East Mason St and Alpine Drive (less than 1 mile west of the intersection of I-43 and East Mason St.) From this intersection turn north onto Alpine Dr. (the opposite direction you turned if you attended this summer's Club picnic at Barb and Bob's home and gardens.) Proceed approx. 0.6 miles to the intersection of Alpine Dr. and Newberry Ave. (Edison Middle School is on the sw corner). Turn left (west) onto Newberry Ave. and drive approx. 1 mile. Morning Star Trail T's with Newberry on the left. Turn onto Morning Star Trail and continue around the curve. The home and gardens are on the left. (If you drive by tennis courts on the right, you have gone too far.)

The GBBG/BAD Buds daylily display beds are located near the chain-linked fence that runs parallel to Larsen Road just west of GBBG's main entrance. Drive through the main gate and park in the first parking bay on your right. Walk west to the metal donor gate (which will be unlocked). Take the concrete walkway on the left toward the well house, turn left down into the small orchard, continue past the well house and walk through the grape-vine covered archway. The daylily beds will be to your left.

Linda Servia lives at 810 Country Club Road which forms the western boundary of Northeast Wisconsin Technical College campus. An entrance into a NWTC parking lot is located just across from Linda's driveway and she encourages you to park your vehicle in the parking lot rather than along Country Club Road. Country Club Road runs north from its intersection with West Mason Street which is also known as Wisconsin Highway 54. Access to West Mason Street can be gained from US 41 (I-43).
